We are excited to welcome professional calligrapher Caroline David, owner of Plume and Flourish, the company she



## COUNTERMEASURES TO CYBERATTACKS THAT TARGET COMPANIES AND GOVERNMENT ENTITIES

WITH BILL NELSON, CHAIR OF THE GLOBAL RESILIENCE FEDERATION (GRF)

In the last 15 years, there has been an increase in the number and sophistication of cyberattacks. Mr. Nelson will provide an overview of these different threats and how to protect and defend against them. These include phishing account takeovers, business email compromise, distributed denial of service (DDoS), ransomware, and destructive malware.

**Bill Nelson** is the Chair of the Global Resilience Federation (GRF). A few of his major achievements include:

- Provided US Senate and House testimony on cyber risk issues
- Teamed with Microsoft to take down several illegal botnet infrastructures
- Established the Global Resilience Federation to support 17 different industry sectors
- Led an effort to develop an Operational Resilience Framework to facilitate recovery from cyber or other destructive attacks
- Has appeared on CNN, CSPAN, MSNBC and other media outlets

Bill was the CEO of the Financial Services Information Sharing & Analysis Center (FS-ISAC) for twelve years before joining GRF in 2019. GRF is a nonprofit corporation consisting of 17 different information-sharing communities and industries. GRF's mission is to share information which reduces risk and enhances the resiliency of members and their respective sectors.
